## PEACE PROCESS: NSPNC holds meeting with signatories

The National Solidarity and Peace-Making Negotiation Committee (NSPNC) held a meeting with 5 NCA signatory ethnic armed Organizations, which are also members of the Peace Process Steering Team (PPST), - ALP, DKBA, KNU/KNLAPC, LDU and PNLO on 26 June.

This meeting focused on points to be amended in the 2008 Constitution, the matter of being able to implement the points agreed upon in the previous discussions, the issue of holding a peace conference, regional stability and the fight against drugs.


## REPATRIATION of Myanmar trafficked workers:

On 14 June, a group of 6 Myanmar nationals as the third batch was repatriated to Myanmar. These individuals had been victims of trafficking and were forced to work in an online gaming company located near Mabalacat City in Pampanga Province, the Philippines. The first batch of returnees, consisting of 15 men and 5 women, arrived in Myanmar on 27 May. Subsequently, on 2 June, the second batch, comprising 9 men and 6 women, also returned

KKO (Splinter Group) and PDF Terrorists' Shootings of Heavy Weapons Injure a Buddhist Monk


On 15 June, KKO (splinter group) and PDF terrorists fired heavy weapons targeting Kawkareik township of Kayin state and the shells fell and exploded on the main building of Zawtiyarma monastery and its compound. Due to the attack, the abbot monk Bandanta Kawvida got severe injuries.

Security Force Arrests Members of Terrorist Group called Twante Urban Guerrilla who Robbed 'Myat Maung' Jewellery Shop, along with Arms/Ammo and Goldwares

On 18 June 2023, a robbery case took place at the 'Myat Maung' jewellery shop situated in May Darwi Road, ward (I), North Oakkalapa Township, Yangon. In the incident, three male terrorists (under investigation) robbed the shop by holding two staffs at gunpoint, and took varieties of gold ware (worth 1,660 million kyats).

In the incident, security force arrested 25 male perpetrators and one female perpetrator, along with 10 small arms, 15 magazines, five hand-grenades and 627 rounds as well as the robbed gold wares.

Under the instructions of the leaders of the terrorist group called Twante Urban Guerrilla, the terrorist members committed motiveless killings of people for 10 times by accusing them of 'traitor/Dalan' and robberies for three times in Twante Township and Yangon Region. The perpetrators involved in a robbery took refuge in KNLA Brigade No. 6 and received assistance from them. They have committed 20 assassinations.

Tatmadaw Military Columns Crush PDF Terrorists hiding in Sagaing Region, Seized Arms, Ammo and Dead Bodies of the Terrorists

Some local residents who oppose acts of violence secretly provided the tip-off about the terrorists' activities to Tatmadaw military columns that a PDF terrorist group, was hiding along with arms and ammunition in the place near Kingtaw village of Sagaing Region. Responding to the information, Tatmadaw military columns crushed the terrorist on 25 June and seized 15 different types of guns including a sniper rifle, ammunition including two rounds of 107 mm rocket, 5,009 bullet rounds and related materials.

Similarly, Tatmadaw military columns captured 27 different types of guns, ammunition and related materials used in doing acts of violence near Uyin and Latpan Taw villages of Sagaing Region.
